History

- First meeting of A-FCAC Jan. 2018
- Survey & all-day workshop 2018
- Met with key informants
- Assessment Report March 2019
- Age-Friendly Plan Sept. 2019





- March 2020 onset of pandemic
- September 2022 Progress Report to Council
- Municipal Election 2022
- New A-F Committee established





- Report cited 41 Examples of Improvements
 - by township, business, volunteers
- Addressing basic needs of older adults
- Making it easier to get around
- Helping seniors stay connected & informed

- Uxbridge provided \$76,000 in staff and funding/4 years
- This commitment leveraged \$190,000 from other sources
